Licence to practice

If you want to work as a physiotherapist in Sweden, you need a Swedish licence. You need to get your qualifications recognised and you need to have language skills in Swedish, Danish, or Norwegian. You apply for a license to practice at The National Board of Health and Welfare (Socialstyrelsen). You can read more and apply at <https://www.socialstyrelsen.se/en/>

You do not need an offer of employment to apply for the Swedish licence. You may even consider applying for the licence twice, the first time without fulfilling the language requirements to get you professional recognition. This helps you and the employer to estimate if you need further courses or internships to complete your education with.

Benefits - Targeted Mobility Scheme (TMS)

Requirements

- Registered physiotherapist within the EU/EEA.
